## GREENLEE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS CLIFTON, ARIZONA

## September 4, 2012

The Greenlee County Board of Supervisors met on this date in regular session in the Board Meeting Room, 2<sup>nd</sup> floor Courthouse Annex, Clifton, Arizona, with the following members present: Richard Lunt, Chairman; David Gomez, Member; and Ron Campbell, Member. Also present were Deborah K. Gale, County Administrator, and Yvonne Pearson, Clerk of the Board.

Chairman Lunt called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. and Supervisor Campbell led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Board convened as the Board of Directors of the Greenlee County Public Health Services District and upon motion by Supervisor Gomez, seconded by Supervisor Campbell, and carried unanimously, the Board approved the Public Health Services District Consent Agenda as follows:

- 1. <u>Clerk of the Board</u>: Approval of Public Health Services District expense warrants in excess of \$1,000.00
- 2. <u>Health & County Services Director</u>: Approval of the Intergovernmental Agreement with Arizona Department of Health Services for the Woman, Infant and Children Program effective October 1, 2012 and ending September 30, 2015.
- 3. <u>Health & County Services Director</u>: Approval of the Intergovernmental Agreement with the Arizona Department of Health Services for the Well Woman Healthcheck Program effective July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2013
- 4. <u>Health & County Services Director</u>: Approval of Amendment #4 of the Intergovernmental Agreement with the Arizona Department of Health Services for the Emergency Preparedness Program

This being the date set for the canvass of the 2012 Primary Election held Tuesday, August 28, 2012, the Board of Supervisors proceeded to canvass the returns as presented. Upon motion by Supervisor Campbell, seconded by Supervisor Gomez, and carried unanimously, the following candidates by virtue of having received the highest number of votes cast were officially declared to be nominees for their respective parties for the county office for the General Election to be held on November 6, 2012. The canvass, in its entirety, will be included in the minutes at the end of this day's proceedings.

Justice of the Peace, District 1, Grace Nabor, requested that the Board consider a boundary change between the two Justice of the Peace Districts. She stated that due to a decrease in criminal violations being referred to her office she will receive a decrease in salary. She requested that the boundary be repositioned to the center line of Highway 191 and Highway 78 with the south side of the center line being in District 2 and the north side of the center line being in District 1. Currently there is a difference in the number of productivity points between the two districts which directly impacts the salaries of the Justices of the Peace (JP's). She stated that realigning the boundary would make the traffic case workload more evenly distributed which would make the salaries more fairly equal.

Justice of the Peace, District 2, Jon Basteen stated that he agreed with the change in boundaries as presented by JP Nabor. He also presented other statistics related to the number of traffic citations that are being cited by the Sheriff's Deputies comparing the Sheriff's Office to the duties of the Department of Safety (DPS). Sheriff Tucker rebutted the information provided explaining that the responsibilities of the Sheriff are different and more widespread than the duties of DPS. JP Basteen also stated that since he will not be seeking re-election in two years that this would be a good time for the Board to consider combining the two districts into just one district as a cost saving measure.

Upon motion by Supervisor Gomez, seconded by Supervisor Campbell and carried unanimously, the Board approved the change in Justice of the Peace boundaries to be the center line of Highway 191 from the Graham County line to Three Way and the center line of Highway 78 from Three Way to the New Mexico border.

The Board directed the County Administrator to explore the ability to combine the two JP districts into one district.

Upon motion by Supervisor Campbell, seconded by Supervisor Gomez, and carried unanimously, the Board convened into Public Hearing for the Planning and Zoning request by Jack and Nancy Lane to rezone Assessor Parcel 300-92-009 and 300-86-019 from RU36 to TR36 located on Ward Canyon Road.

Mr. Philip Ronnerud, County Engineer, stated that the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended stipulations as presented and to rezone as TR18 instead of TR36. There have been no comments received for or against the request. Chairman Lunt requested

clarification as to what the record of easement is on this property including the road easement. There were no comments from the public present.

The Board reconvened into regular session.

Upon motion by Supervisor Gomez, seconded by Supervisor Campbell, and carried unanimously, the Board tabled the Planning and Zoning request of Jack and Nancy Lane due to the wording on the agenda and the information presented during the public hearing. The item will be brought back at the next Board meeting.

Ms. Pearson requested the cancellation of the following Greenlee County School Governing Board Elections pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes §15-424(D); Blue Elementary School District; Clifton Unified School District; Eagle Elementary School District; Morenci Unified School District. Upon motion by Supervisor Gomez, seconded by Supervisor Campbell, and carried unanimously, the Board approved the request as presented.

Ms. Gale reported the following:

• It has been determined that the person being convicted of murder in the Looby case has to be sent to Arizona State Hospital instead of the Pima County Hospital for restoration to competency in order to stand trial. The court has determined that the Pima County program is not sufficient for this individual. This will increase the cost to the County significantly.

The Calendar of Events was reviewed.

Upon motion by Supervisor Gomez, seconded by Supervisor Campbell, and carried unanimously, the Board approved the Consent Agenda as follows:

The exercise will include the county Search & Rescue, Sheriff's Office, Marines and residents of Blue. The Blue area is similar to areas in Afghanistan making it an ideal place for the exercises. The exercise will occur in April 2013.

Supervisor Gomez reported the following:

A. The Arizona State University Tourism Student project is on its way to being organized with 67 students showing an interest in coming to Greenlee County to conduct the project. They have asked for assistance with lodging and food discounts. Another teleconference will take place tomorrow at 11:00 a.m. with further discussion to take place regarding the project.

There being no further information to come before the Board of Supervisors, the meeting was adjourned at 11:19 a.m.
